Making Your Will

Making a Will can set your mind at rest and ensure you can help those people and causes closest to your heart.

Take professional advice in making a Will, to ensure your intentions are met and understood clearly.

When you die, your estate will be subject to inheritance tax. If you leave money to charity your estate could benefit from reliefs from inheritance tax. Taking advice can help with this.

It is very important that your Will identifies clearly the intended beneficiary and that you identify the purpose clearly, either a general purpose, or for a specific church or for a specific purpose. Please do ask for advice about suitable words so your intentions cannot be misunderstood.


To support the Friends gifts should be made to The Friends of Christchurch Priory (Registered Charity number 1063246).


Unrestricted gifts to the Parish of Christchurch
